## **Indoor Scoring**


In last month's update I set you all a few indoor scoring questions, and promised to publish the answers this month.

Can I thank those of you who sent in their answers, some of which I managed to reply to, but not all unfortunately.

To remind you what the questions were I have reproduced them below, with the answers, and most importantly the procedure for attaining those answers under them.

Q1.

1. Calculate the value of each individual arrow

Top Face = 8 Middle Face = 9 - 7 Bottom Face = -

2. Where there is more than one arrow in a target face the lowest value is taken, the other arrows are recorded as misses

Top Face = 8 Middle Face = 9 M - 7 Bottom Face = -

3. Determine scoring order

8 - 7 - M

4. Record the 3 lowest arrow values

8 - 7 - M

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5. For each arrow shot out of time you need to strike out the highest scoring value and mark it as a miss. The original value must be recorded in case there is an appeal, which if upheld will reinstate the original value.

Q2.

1. Calculate the value of each individual arrow

Top Face = 9 Middle Face = 8 Bottom Face = 9 - 8

2. Where there is more than one arrow in a target face the lowest value is taken, the other arrows are recorded as misses

Top Face = 9 Middle Face = 8 Bottom Face = 9 M - 8

3. Determine scoring order

9 - 8 - 8 - M

4. Record the 3 lowest arrow values

8 - 8 - M

5. For each arrow shot out of time you need to strike out the highest scoring value and mark it as a miss. The original value must be recorded in case there is an appeal, which if upheld will reinstate the original value.

Q3.

1. Calculate the value of each individual arrow

3. Determine scoring order

10 - 9 - 7

4. Record the 3 lowest arrow values

10 - 9 - 7
